

Fund Outline

The Fund aims to maximise risk-adjusted total returns to investors by identifying and investing in a number of investment funds (underlying funds) with a focus on those assessed to have superior return potential. The Fund will be managed principally by adjusting the mix of underlying funds. Investing in underlying funds means the Fund can be exposed to a broad range of investments and asset classes. The goal is to manage the mix of underlying funds so as to obtain the combination of investment strategies that Bateau Asset Management believes will achieve the Fund's objectives. Initially the Fund will be up to 100% invested in the Ddraig Equity Fund, an underlying unlisted fund domiciled in the Cayman Islands, committed to delivering compelling risk adjusted investment returns with a focus on opportunities across global equities.

The Fund targets a return of 8-11% p.a. after fees and expenses over a period of 5 years.

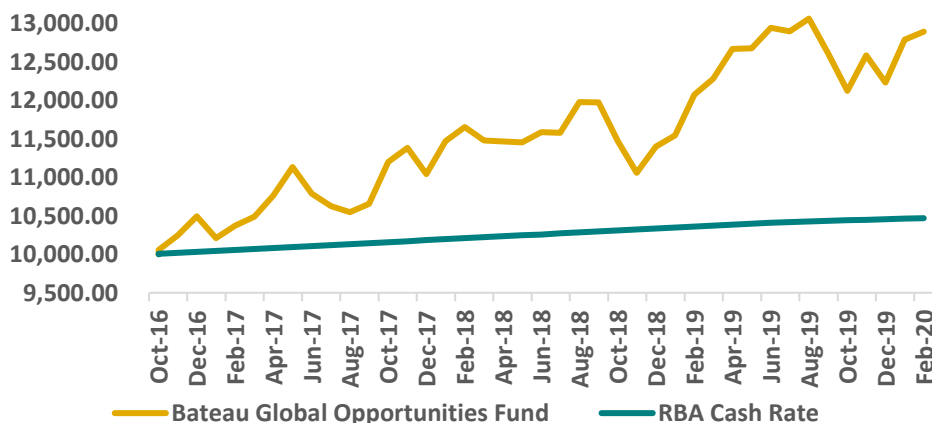

Factsheet as at 29 February 2020

Global Markets Update:

- US markets. US markets were weaker in the month, with the Dow Jones down -10.7% and S&P500 down -8.41%, on concerns of a prolonged global economic slowdown from the coronavirus.
- Long-dated US treasury yields were lower, with the 2-Yr yield at 0.91% and 10-Yr yield at 1.15%.
- European markets. European markets declined with the Stoxx Europe 600 Index down -8.54%, UK FTSE down -9.68% and German DAX down -8.41%.
- Asian markets. Asian markets were lower over the month, with the Nikkei down -8.89%, KOSPI down -6.23%, and the Shanghai Composite declining -3.23%.
- Commodities. Over the month, WTI oil price slumped -13.39% to US\$44.76/bbl, iron ore prices declined -8.26% to US\$81.92 per tonne and spot gold declined -0.22% to US\$1,586 per ounce.
- ASX performance. The ASX200 declined -8.21%.

In political news:

- Coronavirus outbreak continued to rattle economies around the world with World Health Organization (WHO) raising its global risk level for the virus and International Monetary Fund (IMF) predicting the epidemic would shave -0.1% points off global growth.
- China vowed to lower levies on \$75bn of U.S. goods.
- Chancellor of the Exchequer Sajid Javid resigned, causing speculation the U.K. may move toward more fiscal stimulus.
- The U.S. Senate voted to acquit U.S. President Donald Trump on the first article of impeachment, abuse of power, and on the second charge, obstruction of Congress.

In economic news:

- Australian RBA decision. The RBA left the cash rate unchanged at 0.75%, but cut it by -25bps to a new record low of 0.5% in March.
- International Energy Agency warned that global oil demand will drop this quarter for the first time in over a decade as the coronavirus batters China's economy.
- US. The US Feds announced an emergency -50bps cut to interest rates in an effort to stem slower economic growth on the back of the coronavirus outbreak.
- The People's Bank of China pledged 1.2 trillion yuan (\$173bn) in liquidity via open market reverse repo operations to shore up their financial markets, offered 200bn yuan of one-year loans and lowered the rate it charges for the money by -10bps to 3.15%. The Bank also announced a reduction in the lending benchmark rate, reducing the 1-year LPR by -10bps and 5-year LPR by -5bps.
- Moody's Investor Service lowered China's 2020 growth forecast to 5.2% from 5.8% and S&P Global Ratings warned that Chinese lenders could be hit by as much as \$1.1 trillion in questionable loans amid impact of the deadly virus.

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
